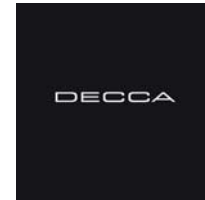

Achieves Greenguard® Indoor Air Quality Certification**

Greenguard certification reflects Decca's environmental focus and ongoing commitment to sustainability.

Minneapolis, MN: February 16, 2009 – Decca Contract Furniture, as a part of its Citizen Decca environmental initiative, announces that it is the first Asian-based manufacturer to achieve Greenguard® certification for its contract casegoods products. Decca casegoods have been tested for their chemical emissions performance and are now Greenguard Indoor Air Quality Certified as low-emitting furnishings.

John W. Fischbach, president of Decca Contract Furniture, says, "We are proud to have achieved Greenguard certification – and, through our Citizen Decca program, we will continue to work to ensure that our products positively impact the environment and promote safe, healthy places to work. Certification is consistent with our core values and our commitment to our customers who seek responsible manufacturing partners."

To achieve Greenguard certification, interior building products must meet the requirements of the Greenguard Environmental Institute (GEI), an independent, non-profit organization established to improve public health and quality of life through programs that improve indoor air. Greenguard certification is an important tool for architects, designers and product specifiers who want to specify low-emitting products to meet new guidelines for green-built environments.

With more than 40 participating furniture manufacturers, Greenguard certification is the most recognized program for specifying low-emitting furniture for high-performance green interiors. Certification can also be part of a strategy that helps a project earn points in the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) rating system and certification program developed by the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC). Projects earn points and are rated in six categories, including: Sustainable Sites, Water Efficiency, Energy & Atmosphere, Materials & Resources, Indoor Environmental Quality and Innovation in Design.

“Greenguard certification is one more step on the path to sustainability,” says Fischbach. “In the last decade, Decca has emerged as a leader in the global marketplace and we are moving forward in our role as an active citizen of the world, a citizen who does its share to address the needs of society and the environment.”
